QUESTION OF THE WEEK

Question for Adults/Pregunta para los adultos: Why do you suppose Jesus was so kind to Zacchaeus? What lesson do you draw from this reading regarding those who are considered "public sinners" today? ¿Por qué cree que Jesús fue tan amable con Zaqueo? ¿Qué lección extrae de esta lectura con respecto a aquellos que se consideran "pecadores públicos" en el presente?

Question for Children/Pregunta para los jóvenes: Jesus saw Zacchaeus as he was — mistakes and all and he sees you the same way. What masks, if any, do you hide behind so others won't see who you really are? WEEKLY REFLECTION

Look at how Jesus treated Zacchaeus, a man despised by others. He was a dishonest tax collector and not the kind of person respectable people would want to have around. Jesus did not tell Zacchaeus how bad he was nor what he should do. Instead, Jesus simply said he wanted to stay at Zacchaeus' house. That simple act of respect and kindness changed Zacchaeus' life. Consider how you treat others. Is your respect and kindness reserved for those you deem "worthy" or do you extend it to everyone? While we cannot change others, our words and deeds can inspire others to become better people.
