QUESTION OF THE WEEK

Question for Adults/Pregunta para los adultos: When you are tempted to try to satisfy your “thirst for meaning” through some other means, what keeps you coming back to the living water of intimacy with Christ? WEEKLY REFLECTION

There have always been serious divisions between the various religions of the world – each group holding fast to their beliefs and firmly declaring that anyone who does not believe as they do is wrong or even evil. In Jesus’ day, the Samaritans were a despised sect and no righteous Jew would have anything to do with them, much less a woman at the well. Yet Jesus takes time to talk to the Samaritan woman at the well. He does not condemn her. He does not put her down in any way. On the contrary, he treats her with respect and kindness and even tells her that he is the Messiah (something that he does not normally proclaim to anyone). Consider how you treat those who do not hold your beliefs – do you follow the example Jesus has given us? **Read Psalm 95:7-8**
